# **ODel Directorate Opens New Horizons** in Education



Globally, there has been a gradual paradigm shift from the traditional Face to Face modes of study, which take place in a conventional classroom setting, to online learning. Today, many universities have embraced

Open, Distance and E-Learning (ODeL) modes of study as a way of leveraging technology to open up opportunities for higher education and consequently achieve their core mandate of teaching, research and innovation. People who are geographically disadvantaged, formally or informally employed; and/or have time constraints are particularly advantaged by the ODeL modes of pedagogy.

Cognizant of the importance of digital learning in advancing educational opportunities, SEKU constituted a directorate of ODeL in December 2022. The Directorate is headed by a director, who works closely with an established board to ensure that the activities of the Directorate are run as prescribed in the University's ODeL policy. The board is chaired by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic, Research and Innovation) and is mandated to ensure quality delivery of e-learning programmes regarding instruction and learning; and in line with the SEKU's vision 'to be a globally competitive Centre of Excellence in teaching, research and innovation, and service'.

The Directorate has planned to start off its operations with Distance Learning, through a pilot programme focused on three-degree programmes namely Bachelor of Education–ARTS, Master of Education and Master of Business Administration. In October and November, Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) will be trained on how to write interactive e-content modules, after which they will engage in the actual writing of the same. The First Year, first semester modules will be ready and uploaded on the SEKUs Learning Management System (LMS) by end of March 2024 in readiness for the admission of the first cohort of students in May 2024.

# Reinforcing the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Enabled Instructional Pedagogy through Holistic Education



## Staff Awarded Scholarship to Train in Kenya Sign Language



Two members of staff from South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU), Dr. Sarah Ndanu M. Ngesu (Coordinator, Disability Mainstreaming Unit) and Ms. Gladys Mawia Muthengi (a committee member, Disability Mainstreaming Unit) were awarded a heavily contested award. With 1,300 applicants from

different institutions in Kenya, only 300 were awarded the coveted scholarship. Kenya Sign Language is a visual language that uses gestures and facial expressions to communicate.

The Kenya Sign Language (KSL) programme for Kenya National Council for Persons with Disabilities (NCPWD) targets essential government workers including lecturers, teachers, nurses, front office workers, community social workers, chiefs, police officers, huduma centre personnel and other essential public workers. The objective of the programme is to equip trainees with basic sign language skills to enhance effective communication to the hearing impaired seeking services in public institutions. Over the years the Council has continued to support government workers to enroll in the programme through funding to training partnered institutions. In the last five years the council has invested a total of 47, 565, 000 in the programme. During the training, we were given field work assignment to visit NCPWD offices. During the visit, we interacted with the officers at NCPWD HQ's at Nairobi, who informed us that the programme has contributed immensely towards improving service delivery to the hearing impaired in public service by ensuring that the graduands are re-deployed in strategic areas to serve the hearing impaired. This is a great milestone!

The KSL training programme was managed by NCPWD who provide the funding or sponsorship to public service employees. However, the part of teaching and training was carried out by teachers/tutors from Kenya Institute of Special Education (KISE) who for many years have been training on special needs including KSL. The National Council for Persons living with Disabilities, as a government entity, has made it clear that every institution in Kenya should have at least two staff trained on basic skills on KSL at the minimum level of certificate. South Eastern Kenya University has three trained staff members with certificate in KSL ( Dr. Sarah Ndanu Ngesu, Dr. Redempta Kiilu and Ms. Gladys Muthengi). This is a great milestone for SEKU for inclusion.

The training covered many aspects such as: Historical development of KSL, the deaf culture, principles of signing, composition of a sign, elements of a sign, finger-spelling, etiquette and dialogue, the structure of KSL, practical sessions on how to sign words in many different fields and 3 weeks attachment in a deaf school just to mention a few.

The SEKU staff were placed in Mwingi Special School for the Hearing Impaired (Dr. Sarah Ngesu) and Kitui School for the Deaf (Ms. Gladys Muthengi). These SEKU staff have since become ambassadors of SEKU in those schools. During the practical training at Mwingi School for the Deaf, I was astonished by the responsiveness of the hearing impaired learners. The learners had a high sense of acceptance. They accepted and interacted freely with each other, staff members, workers and visitors. This is such a strong character that is rare in hearing people who have so many issues that alienate each other like race, colour, sex, education, ethnicity, religion and economic status. At Mwingi School for the Hearing Impaired, learners interacted freely in a friendly manner without groupings of tribe, class or education status. Thus, it can be deduced that the hearing impaired community is deeply connected and supportive of each other, and their unity is evident in their oneness and collaboration. This is in sharp contrast to schools for hearing learners where students often group themselves according to their background, tribes and presumed status. I wish this can be emulated by all people in Kenya.

The KSL training was an eye opener, a learning process that left a remarkable impact to the trainees. On behalf of my colleague Ms. Gladys Muthengi, we highly appreciate the SEKU Management for granting us three (3) and half month's study leave to train on Kenya Sign Language. It is my prayer that a certificate in KSL will be taught in SEKU someday where all staff members and students will be able to learn basic skills on KSL for inclusion.

# The School of Law Opens Doors to

## Legal Excellence in South Eastern Kenya



The School of Law is situated at the Main Campus in Kwa Vonza, spanning across 10,000 acres of serene and tranquil land. This idyllic setting is enveloped by refreshing air, exquisite flora and fauna, and breathtaking

panoramic views, making it an exceptional and highly conducive place for learning, teaching as well as conducting research and innovation. The School of Law stands as a significant legacy of our Founding Vice Chancellor, Prof. Geoffrey M. Muluvi, and a remarkable achievement attributed to the dedication of the first chairman of the Council, Prof. Raphael Munavu. This vision was nurtured from the days when the institution was a Constituent College of the University of Nairobi.

The School was accredited by the Council of Legal Education (CLE) on 29th November 2022 and was awarded a 5-year license for a Bachelor of Laws (LL.B) programme. This was a culmination of a dream, not just for SEKU but for the region. The South Eastern Kenya region had been yearning for a School of Law to address some of the perennial legal challenges that are unique to the region. These include the niche areas of the programme: Electoral Law, Sustainable Development Law, Dryland Agriculture, and Management and Conservation of Natural Resources and Environment Laws. Domestic and gender-based violence and competition for natural resources such as water and pasture leading to intractable disputes, have also been perennial problems for South Eastern Kenya region, areas that the School of Law will cover in its quest for legal solutions for community resilience.

While legal education will not be a panacea for all these challenges, the local communities have identified the SEKU School of Law as a starting point in collaborating with them to come up with solutions and create jurisprudence that will eventually provide comprehensive and conclusive remedies and innovation. Many of the region's sons and daughters had to travel far to seek legal education, resulting in financial logistical challenges for many.

Therefore, the SEKU School of Law provides access to legal education for the region, Kenya, East Africa and beyond by focusing on transforming lives through its unique niche areas of study. Through legal education, research, innovation, commercialization and outreach services, it hopes to provide sustainable solutions and techniques to help address disputes and barriers to accessing clean energy, greening our institutions, homes, and environment, ensuring food security, and good nutrition, access to clean and portable water resources and to provide legal strategies for replenishing the earth in a sustainable manner. Providing legal solutions in a sustainable manner, and ensuring social justice, democracy, and good governance will contribute to building resilient communities and strong democratic institutions.

SEKU School of Law began offering the LL.B programme beginning September 2023. The School's vision is to be a globally competitive Centre of Excellence in Legal Teaching and Learning, Research, Innovation, Community Service, and Commercialization. Its approach is practical, participatory, skills-oriented, and learner-centred. To achieve this, its delivery methodologies and techniques integrate interactive lectures, seminars and tutorials, plenary and group discussions, simulations and moot courts, case studies, visits and study tours. The methodologies and techniques aim to equip learners with practical knowledge and skills to respond to the demands of the job market, both locally and globally, transforming learners into world-class legal professionals. Assessments are both formative and summative and are aimed at continually keeping track of each learner's progress, and timely redress of any gaps in the learner's academic progress in a personalized way.

SEKU School of Law has a staff establishment of legal scholars who possess a wealth of knowledge and global experience equipped to engage in legal discourse, research, and education at regional, national and global levels. To further enrich the learners' experience, SEKU has engaged highly trained complementary support staff to attend to the administrative, cultural, social, and welfare interests and priorities of learners.

The SEKU Law Library is distinctly state-of-the-art, and equipped to support learning, teaching, research, innovation, commercialization, and community services. The Law Library has adequate study spaces and a wide range of materials, equipment and resources. The library staff is well-trained and current and will provide support to learners and faculty in all aspects including guidance on the procedure for accessing and borrowing library resources, registration for library membership (physical and online), and online and physical library help services.

The School of Law has clear structures of governance distinguishing areas of responsibility, and a framework from which staff work to achieve its goals. The structure of governance of the School of Law is provided for in the SEKU Statutes and Strategic Plan, and the Organogram and consists of the Dean, three Chairpersons of Departments (Public, Private and Commercial Law), an Adjunct Professor, other lecturers and technical and administrative staff. We are excited about the future of the School and plan to turn it into a Centre of Excellence in Legal Education, producing the very best law graduates. We expect that once the School takes off, we shall seek licenses to offer various Diploma Courses such as a Diploma in Legal Studies and para-legal studies and programmes such as a master's degree in law (LL.M.) and a Ph.D. in Law. We also plan to be an excellent Research Centre and a great resource for the University, the Country, Africa and beyond. We also expect to grow in numbers of students, faculty and staff, infrastructure and even stand on our own buildings for the School, Law Library and other facilities. The future of the SEKU School of Law is indeed very bright as we have an opportunity to determine its future and destiny, and that is a great privilege.

### Promoting Legal Education through Alternative Educational Methods

The Public Law Department at South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU) School of Law seeks to provide legal education to students through several exciting ways. The Public Law Department undertakes to provide legal education through vibrant ways such as short courses, moot court competitions, provision of legal aid and research and consultancies. The Department seeks to make a substantial contribution towards the improvement of legal education by building capacity with not only knowledge but practical skills as well.

The Department will be keeping the pace with emerging needs and concerns of stakeholders and constantly skimming the environment for opportunities to improve. Cognizant of the importance of practical skills in legal education, the Department seeks to enhance legal knowledge, improve practical skills as well as inculcate the imperative values and principles enshrined in article 10 of the Constitution of Kenya. The origin that necessitated the promotion of practical skills is the need to build capacity of students in the legal economy and thereby contribute to the objectives of SEKU.

The Department in conjunction with the Department of Computer science at the School of Science and Computing, conducted a webinar in April on the recently enacted Data protection Act for all SEKU Staff and Students. The webinar was keen to sensitise those who deal with institutional data and the obligation in the management of academic data. The University processes large amounts of data for academic purposes and the sensitization of staff and students was key to ensure compliance with the provisions of the Data Protection Act, 2019.

The Department has a clear vision and mandate to not only provide class teaching but outside of the class-room teaching to students for a more hand on approach to litigation, legal advice, structuring arguments, legal research and writing and legal project management.

Short courses provide both students and staff the knowledge on various emerging legal topics. The short courses will be conducted through webinars where all staff and students are educated and given practical examples. The Department seeks to conduct more webinars on new and exciting areas of law such as ICT and the Law, Climate Change Justice, Tax Law among other exciting areas of law.

Moot court competitions are a necessary element in the provision of legal education. The Department seeks to train students on mooting rules and conduct internal moot court competitions for the students to practice their skill set on different litigation strategies such as presenting their case in court, drafting legal pleadings and relation to other court users and court administrators. This will further be cemented by the student's participation in Judicial and Clinical Attachment where the students will be placed in different courts around the country for 8 weeks to learn from the courts. Students will also embark on journeys across Kenya to other law schools to participate in nationwide law school moot courts. This not only provides practical skills but also allows the students to learn from their contemporaries in other law schools across Kenya.

Much of the duties of an advocate and a lawyer is the provision of legal advice to their clients. This is a skill best learnt in the formative years of legal education. Legal aid is essential in that students learn to listen to situations, analyse the matter, identify the issues and the relevant laws applicable and proceed to advise the client accordingly. The Department seeks to start a legal aid club where students will provide legal advice to practical situations. The Legal Aid Act, 2016 in section 2 includes universities as legal aid providers in the provision of legal advice to the public to ensure the furtherance of article 48 of the constitution on Access to Information.

Finally, research and consultancies assist students in learning and conducting research on new and emerging areas of law in Kenya. Through research, students can develop jurisprudence on various matters on the School's niche areas. Research and writing have countless benefits to legal education; they provide knowledge on empirical research, on carrying out literature review and on developing legal knowledge that is important to Kenyans.

In conclusion, the Department has exciting ways to engage students and staff. We look forward to receiving members of the public for engagements on the above plans by the Department and partnerships with key stakeholders within the Kitui Region and beyond.

# **Insights from the Commercial Law Department**



The Commercial Law Department at South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU) is one of the departments in the School of Law. It offers a comprehensive curriculum covering various Bachelor of Law courses, including Contract

Law, Trust and Equity Law, Commercial Law, Business Associations Law, Company Law, Intellectual Property Law, Tax Law, Capital Markets and Securities Law, Competition Law, Accounting for Lawyers, Cooperative and Microfinance Law, Insurance Law, and Labour Law. The Department's vision goes beyond teaching and research; it aims to actively participate in law reform and influence the practical application of commercial law. Graduates from this Department can secure employment in diverse sectors such as banks, insurance companies, law firms, government departments like the Kenya Revenue Authority and Treasury, as well as foreign affairs and trade ministries.

Mr. Mathews Okoth is the inaugural Chair of the Commercial Law Department and possesses a diverse set of skills and qualifications. His expertise spans corporate practice, litigation in both public and private law, public finance litigation, conveyance, commercial transactions, and research consultancy. He is currently pursuing a Doctor of Laws degree and holds a Master of Laws degree in Corporate Law from University College London. He is also a graduate of Moi University with an LLB (Hons) and the Kenya School of Law with a PGD. Additionally, Okoth is an active member of the Law Society of Kenya, contributing to the Editorial Committee and Practice Standards and Ethics Committee. He also serves regionally on the East Africa Law Society Committee on Capital Markets.

In his over twelve-year practice, Okoth has acquired experience in many aspects of corporate litigation. His areas of experience include (i) shareholder disputes; (ii) corporate financing disputes, comprising equity, debt and public-private partnerships financing disputes; (iii) public law litigation disputes, comprising constitutional petitions, election petitions and judicial review; and (iv) private law litigation, comprising contracts, tort, traffic accident claims, employment and labour disputes.

Other than litigation, he is experienced in conveyance and commercial transactions. He has also consulted for local companies and international organizations in corporate legal audits, including company-wide audit for regulatory compliance and legal risks assessment. He is the author of the seminal book *Law of Corporate Finance in Kenya* which offers a comprehensive analysis of corporate finance topics in Kenya, including regulations related to capital structure, debt financing, capital markets, and public-private partnerships.

He has also published peer reviewed articles in leading journals, including the article titled "The Interface between the new and previous land laws in Kenya" in the Africa Nazarene University Law Journal (Juta Company Ltd Publication: June 2013), at pages 107-121; the article titled "From Template Drafting to Informed Drafting: Conceptualising Clauses in Bi-lateral Loan Agreements" (Law Society of Kenya Journal: 2023); and is a contributing author for Hauser Global Law School Programme of New York University where he periodically updates the article "Researching Kenyan Law" available on http://www.nyulawglobal.org/globalex/Kenya1.htm.

His upcoming book projects include book titles, Corporate Insolvency Law and Practice in Kenya and Law of Secured Transactions in Kenya. Okoth is a Law Society of Kenya Continuing Legal Education Trainer, and on August 28th, 2023, he conducted a national Law Society of Kenya CPD Webinar Training for Advocates titled "Legal Framework on Dividends and Company Distributions in Kenya."

# Fostering Agricultural Innovation with Ruforum Recap Project

The RUFORUM RECAP project has been a driving force behind agricultural innovation and entrepreneurship at South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU). By incubating diverse value chains, the project has significantly boosted agricultural start-ups across Kenya. Guided by Dr. Julius Kilungo, SEKU established the Seku-Agribiz Incubation Hub for Innovations, focusing on training students in essential business skills to address youth unemployment

Over three years, the project has trained 114 students in business ideation, proposal formulation, and product development. Notable innovations include dried mango slices/flakes, dried cowpea leaves, and cassava and sweet potato chips. These initiatives have positively impacted mango, cowpea, cassava, sweet potato, and pineapple value chains. By procuring raw products from local farmers, the project supports start-ups producing a variety of processed goods, enhancing the value and profitability of these crops.

# Participation in International Academic Conferences at Howard University – Washington DC USA

In the recent past, I have been honored to be invited twice to present my research findings at academic conferences at Howard University, Washington, DC – USA on Kiswahili and translation.

The first conference took place from 29th September to 4th October 2022 and was organized by Chama cha Ukuzaji wa Kiswahili Duniani (CHAUKIDU). CHAUKIDU is a global organization for the promotion of Kiswahili where I have been serving in the executive committee in the position of publicity secretary after being elected in competitive elections in 2020 and 2023. I am humbled to ably represent South Eastern Kenya University in this organization which is registered in the USA but which draws Kiswahili scholars and stakeholders from all over the world. The 2022 conference was entirely on Kiswahili and related disciplines like translation and interpreting. In addition to being in the organizing committee for this conference, I presented a paper entitled: Tafsiri kama Nyenzo ya Ukuzaji na Uendelezaji wa Lugha za Kiafrika (Translation as Channel towards the Development of African Languages).

The second conference took place on 13th to 15th October 2022. The conference was organized by African Language Teachers Association (ALTA) which is registered in the USA. The organization's main objective is to mainly promote African languages taught in USA as foreign languages. Of these languages, Kiswahili is a major African language taught in the USA.

In this conference, I presented two papers: "Handling regional Kiswahili variations in Translation and Interpretation" which was written in English. The other paper entitled "Tafsiri na ubadilishaji msimbo kama mbinu za kifasihi: Mfano wa nyimbo za injili za Stephen Kasolo na Stella Mengele" (Translation and Code-switching as literary stylistic devices: the case of gospel songs by Stephen Kasolo and Stella Mengele)

The two conferences were of great value to me as a scholar, researcher and lecturer of Kiswahili and translation. My participation in the two international conferences gave me a chance to stay at the forefront of my field. It was a great experience to commune intellectually with like-minded professionals to share and learn about how emerging technologies and inventive thinking can drive innovation on teaching African languages and other related disciplines. Also, I interacted with scholars from different universities in the world and was able to market SEKU. In addition, through interaction with other scholars I was able to lay foundation on future collaboration through MoUs. I sincerely appreciate the Management of South Eastern Kenya University for granting me the opportunity to participate in the above conferences. As Wiseman (2023) asserts when an organization sends an individual or a group to a learning and development conference, the ripple effect is felt far and wide. It not only empowers the attendees with new knowledge and ideas, but when they return to the office and apply the knowledge gained, they are better able to support their fellow employees. This impacts the entire organization's development efforts and realization of her vision and mission.

# Meet the Visionary Leader Behind SEKU's School of Law

Ambassador Dr. Koki Muli Grignon is the inaugural dean of SEKU School of Law, appointed after leading the School of Law Establishment Committee for over a year. Her efforts culminated in the approval of the LL.B. Programme at SEKU by the Council of Legal Education, securing a five-year license on 29th November, 2022.

With a distinguished career spanning 33 years, she has actively championed human rights, women's rights, academia, diplomacy, social justice, constitutional processes, democratization, and fair elections. Dr. Muli Grignon is an Attorney at Law, International Human and Women's Rights, and Constitutional Lawyer. She is also a Commissioner for Oaths, Notary Public, and a Fellow of the Institute of Certified Public Secretaries of Kenya (ICS). Her expertise extends to elections, democracy, and governance and is an accrediting facilitator of Building Resources in Democracy Governance and Elections (BRIDGE – www.bridge-project.org). She has trained professionals globally and observed numerous elections across Africa, the United Kingdom, and the United States.

Previously, she served as the Ambassador and Deputy Permanent Representative of Kenya to the United Nations Headquarters in New York in December 2012, representing Kenya, the Africa Group, Group of Seventy-Seven & China, and UN member states.

Before her diplomatic tenure, she held various roles at South Eastern University College (SEUCO), including lecturer and Director/Dean of School of External Studies and Continuing Education and acting Legal Officer of SEKU. Dr. Muli Grignon played a pivotal role in SEKU's transition to an independent full-fledged public University, receiving its Charter in 2013.

Her extensive government roles included serving as the joint secretary of the task force reviewing Press Laws from 1993 to 1995, Commissioner/Board Member of the National Commission on Gender and Development from 2004 to 2007, and member of the National Anti-Corruption Campaign Steering Committee from 2004 to 2005. She collaborated with international organizations such as the United Nations Peace Keeping Missions, UNDP, IGAD, International IDEA, and ICJ-Kenya Section. She also actively participated in the 2003 – 2004 National Constitutional Conference held at Bomas of Kenya.

Additionally, she has collaborated with numerous inter-governmental and non-governmental organizations, including the United Nations (UN) Peace Keeping Missions, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), the Inter-governmental Authority on Development (IGAD), International IDEA, the Institute for Education in Democracy (IED), International Commission of Jurists (ICJ-Kenya Section), among others. Furthermore, she has been a regular columnist in the East Africa Sunday Standard since 2021. Prior to her departure for New York, she also contributed as a columnist to the Saturday Standard in 2011 and 2012.

Dr. Muli Grignon earned her Ph.D. in Law from the University of Dar Es Salaam School of Law, a master's degree in human Rights from the University of London, an LL.B (Hon.) from the University of Nairobi, and a Diploma in Law from the Kenya School of Law. She is deeply rooted in SEKU's growth, having witnessed its evolution since its days as a Constituent College of the University of Nairobi (SEUCO). Dr. Muli Grignon takes immense pride in her enduring association with the institution, contributing significantly to its remarkable milestones and achievements since 2011.

We ensure that each Council member is issued with the relevant organization's legal documents such as Strategic Plan, Board Charter, Code of Conduct and Ethics, and Mwongozo among other relevant documents. We also maintain and update the register of attendance and conflict of interests and facilitate the Board/Council evaluation process usually done by the State Corporations Advisory Committee (SCAC). We coordinate the governance audit process and maintain a cordial and professional relationship with the board membership. We also organize various Board/Council activities and facilitate their participation in university activities like graduation ceremonies, inspection of new campuses, and other important university events and activities. She is also in charge of the University's legal services including advising the Council, Management, various organs of the University, and the University at large.

### A Graduand's Journal

In the hallowed halls of SEKU, our journey began in 2019, a vibrant canvas of exploration and youthful exuberance.

Our matriculation ceremony on 30th August was a pivotal moment, our dearest Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academics, Research and Students affair, then, Prof. Zipporah, oozed her wisdom. For once, I thought she had some bloodline from Socrates. One of her most outstanding pieces of advice that shaped my academic focus was her warning of lurking snakes in the SEKU compound yet assuring us safety if we did not venture into the bushes.

It was later that I understood this was a literal but a philosophical matter. Additionally, she ignited a spark, reminding us that this was the beginning of a journey through which our stories and destiny will be rewritten.

But campus life was not to be a bed full of roses as we had thought despite the freedom hype. "Muchele kojolea" which was plain rice with bean soup became our everyday meal at the central Mess, a simple meal shared with roommates that bound us together. My dream and passion for teaching seemed shattered as I was now trapped into pursuing a "Bachelor of Being Around" (BA). The course was almost not going to be offered due to quorum issues. I looked down upon myself and labeled myself as a terrible failure in life. I was depressed that I even contemplated suicide but thanks to friends like Evoslyne who I met in my first geography lecture. She made me feel encouraged and I braced myself to fight on.

This made majority of students look for alternative accommodation at Kwa Vonza colloquially "Kwa Vumbi". KV experience hardened most of us to be resilient.
