In 1956, Crick stated the central dogma of molecular biology describing the flow of information from DNA to RNA to protein.¹ Although the process of information transmission was oversimplified, the central dogma hinted at the wealth of information that can be extracted from every biological sequence. The mining of information from nucleotide and protein sequences prompted the development of bioinformatics, the science that interfaces biology and computer science to answer biological questions on a molecular level. Sequence-based discovery allows the elucidation of the relationships between structure, function, and evolution.



Abstract
Purpose – This study aims to provide a better understanding of the barriers and constraints that are faced by women entrepreneurs in starting and running a business in Kenya.
Design/methodology/approach – The study draws on primary research conducted through face-to-face interviews with female entrepreneurs in Kenya in a wide range of sectors, each having their own micro enterprise. It draws on the framework of Bates *et al.* (2007) and Baughn *et al.* (2006) to look at the entrepreneurship landscape in Kenya and the barriers and constraints faced by women entrepreneurs, as well as the support and opportunities available.
Findings – It was found that female entrepreneurs in Kenya face far fewer barriers to starting micro-enterprises now than ever before. It is proving to be a widely successful model, which they use to lift themselves and their families out of poverty. There remain, however, a number of barriers to growth within the micro-enterprise sector. On the basis of these, the paper argues that for female entrepreneurship to have a greater impact on economic growth within Kenya, the country needs to introduce more effective policies, regulation of the informal sector and further support to women entrepreneurs. For example, support could take the form of business training, mentoring and financial support.
Originality/value – The paper presents original research on the growing phenomenon of female entrepreneurship in Kenya as a means of alleviating poverty. It considers how this trend relates to the growing availability of microfinance.
